Operation Encompass

We are proud to share that we are an Operation Encompass school. This as a is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and all police forces, in order to protect children and families.

Essentially - Every school appoints a trained Key Adult - the Key Adult is the person who receives information about police attended Domestic Abuse incidents.

The Key Adult will be notified prior to the start of the next school day that the police have attended an incident of domestic abuse. This timely information sharing enables appropriate support to be provided for that child so that all interactions, from when the child first arrives at the school gates, are of a positive nature.

The Key Adult at Poppy Field is Nicky Hadfield (Head of School).

Our School Improvement Plan -

At Poppy Field we strive to consistently be the best we can. As you will be aware, we care passionately about the children in our care and work hard to ensure we are doing the very best for every one of them.

Every year we will reflect and look at how we can do better than the year before, and set ourselves some targets based on the question - how can we improve?

This year we have four key areas that we are focusing on:
